

2022 Strategic Activities

Thank you to our CTC faculty and staff for all the work and contributions you have made towards the development of our 2022 Strategic Activities.

The vision and mission which we have articulated as part of our long-term strategic intent is made achievable with our focused strategic objectives that will guide us for the next three years (2021-2023). These objectives and its corresponding goals serve as a bridge between our mission-vision and our annual strategic activities. 
Who would you recommend CTC to?
