To be eligible for the award of Bachelor of Divinity students must complete a minimum of

360 credits, which includes:

- 1. 30 credits Philosophy
- 2. **60** credits **Sacred Scripture** (at least 15 credits from Old Testament studies and 15 credits from New Testament studies
- 3. 60 credits Dogmatic Theology
- 4. PLUS another **30** credits of **either** Sacred Scripture **or** Dogmatic Theology
- 5. 15 credits Moral Theology
- 6. 30 credits Pastoral Studies and Practice
- 7. 15 credits Church History and Patrology
- 8. At least **90** credits must be at **stage 3** (x3xxx)
- No more than 180 credits at stage 1 (x1xxx)
- 10. No more than **150** credits from any one area of study
