
Message from the Dean

It was an opportunity to recognise the intense time of learning, commitment, and hard work of our students in their respective degree levels. It was also a time to thank the faculty, staff, and their respective whanau for accompanying them in their academic journey.

Feast of Corpus Christi

As we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ the Lord we are reminded of the words of Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger in 2002 when he delivered a lecture wherein he expounded on the topic of Eucharistic Ecclesiology: "For St Paul and the Fathers of the Church the idea of the Church as the Body of Christ was inseparably connected with the concept of the Eucharist in which the Lord is bodily present and which He gives us His Body as food. ... The Eucharist binds all men together, and not just with one



another, but with Christ; in this way it makes them 'Church'. At the same time the formula describes the fundamental constitution of the Church: the Church exists in Eucharistic communities. The Church's Mass is her constitution, because the Church is, in essence, a Mass (sent out: "missa"), a service of God, and therefore a service of man and a service for the transformation of the world."

There are several ways you can use the Library:


You can come and borrow in person during business hours.
