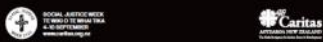

## Message from the Dean

Dr John Evangelista



We have been honoured by the visit of the Papal Nuncio, His Excellency Archbishop Novatus Rugambwa last Friday, 19 August 2022.

The Papal Nuncio thanked CTC and the seminaries for the great work they are doing for the Church. He encouraged us to continue our work despite the many challenges we are facing especially in a very secular environment like what we have today.

He urged the faculty, staff, and students never to falter in our work of evangelisation despite the apparent “problems” the Church is experiencing. But he also reminded us that this work of evangelisation

starts with our own selves. We need to look inwardly and decide to change for the better – to be truly faithful to Christ.

“The Institutes of Catholic Higher Education, like Te Kupenga Catholic Theological College, are invited by the Church to indicate academic avenues that will lead not only to defeat secularism academically but also (and especially) to strengthen the Faith in the midst of this battle; to invite the people to focus our heart, mind and soul not only on worldly realities, but also (and especially) on Jesus Christ and His Church.”

CTC has a wonderful church history course: *The Catholic Church in New Zealand*. One assignment involves using primary and secondary sources to tell the story of a person or a ministry. In our library we always welcome donations and suggestions for purchase for local church histories. These as well as honouring and acknowledging the past they inform and encourage us in ministry. Family stories are valued by family historians as well as academics looking closely at the local area.
