What this prospectus is all about


Kia ora!

About Te Kupenga Catholic Theological College

We are the successor organisation to Good Shepherd College and The Catholic Institute. The resources and experience of these two institutions are now combined in a single tertiary provider aimed at formation for ministry and leadership.

We were set up by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Conference to develop leaders for the Catholic Community – in schools, parishes, social and pastoral services.

Catholic Theological College is the branch of Te Kupenga that deals with Tertiary Education. We provide courses at levels 5, 6 and 7 on the National Qualifications Framework.

We are an NZQA registered Private Training Establishment with a particular focus on providing courses for seminarians and for teachers in Catholic schools, yet open to anyone who wants to study the theological disciplines at a post-secondary level.

Why study the Certificate in Christian Studies?

The Certificate in Christian Studies is divided into two strands:

Christian Ministry

This qualification will give you the knowledge and skills to confidently work in many areas of Christian Ministry. This qualification is for those interested in or already working or volunteering in parishes. This certificate is separated in four specialised areas:

- NZCCS-CM Parish
- NZCCS-CM Christian Leadership
- NZCCS-CM Hospital or Prison Ministry
- NZCCS-CM Catholic Youth Ministry

Religious Education

This strand is open to those who are either at a University College of Education, or who are teachers in schools. NZCCS-RE will provide you with the knowledge to teach Religious Education confidently and competently and to contribute to the Catholic character of a school.

Study anywhere

Our courses are available around the country. We offer a mix of face-to-face classes, online, distance and blended learning.

A full-time student can complete all credits in a year, if they are doing 3 to 4 papers each semester. Those who are studying part time may take up to four years to complete the papers. We can assist you when planning out your study.

Library Services

The Colin Library has been serving the Catholic Church in New Zealand for over a century, and has been the academic resource for all students at CTC and other Catholic institutions.

Students have free access to thousands of theological eBooks and eJournal articles available .

It also has on-line catalogue of print and electronic materials, including article level retrieval for some eJournals.

Our library staff can help with research questions, in person, by phone or email and will send answers to you.

Students can either visit the main library on Ponsonby Road, Auckland or contact our helpful library staff at library@ctc.ac.nz.

Once you become a student, you will be enrolled in the library system and be able to manage your account.

Student Support

The pastoral support of our students has a holistic approach focused on their overall wellbeing, meeting their needs as students, and helping them to become independent and successful learners. We endeavour to create a physical, mental, and emotional safe learning environment where our students feel respected and appreciated, and can grow in their Christian knowledge as well as their academic skills. a community that know and care about each other, CTC offers our students academic and pastoral support through lecturers, staff and the pastoral care office.

New Zealand Certificate in Christian Studies – Christian Ministry (NZCCS-CM)

The NZCCS-CM will give you the knowledge and skills to confidently work in many areas of Christian Ministry. This certificate is for those interested in or already working in parishes, children's liturgy, sacramental preparation, RCIA, visiting the sick, prison ministers or youth ministers. Graduates are employed in either paid or voluntary ministry work. There are four options to choose from:

- NZCCS-CM Parish
- NZCCS-CM Christian Leadership
- NZCCS-CM Hospital or Prison Ministry
- NZCCS-CM Catholic Youth Ministry

The qualification is NZQA registered and CTC is approved to teach it. It is a 60 credit, level 5 programme. To gain the qualification you will need to complete 6 papers. Each paper is 10 credits. Most students study part-time and you have up to 4 years to complete the certificate.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT Open to all students 17 years and over.

New Zealand Certificate in Christian Studies -Religious Education (NZCCS-RE)

The qualification is for those studying at a University College of Education who would like to teach in a Catholic school and for qualified teachers.

The NZCCS-RE will provide you with the knowledge and skill to confidently and competently teach Religious Education and to meaningfully engage in a school's Catholic character.

This qualification is NZQA registered and CTC is approved to teach it. It is an 80 credit, level 5 programme of study. To gain the qualification, you will need to successfully complete 7 papers. Six papers are 10 credits, one paper is 20 credits. Students at University Colleges of Education may complete the programme within a year, however most students study part-time. You have 4 years to complete the NZCCS-RE.

All papers from the NZCCS-RE are offered online. Many of the papers are also offered as face-to-face classes. Please check the timetable to see what may be on offer where you live.

Programme Structure

There are 7 papers that you must complete in order to receive this award. 6 Courses in Theology, Scripture and Religious Education and 1 Practicum (for trainee teachers) or 1 project/portfolio (for practicing teachers)

- SC502 Interpreting the New Testament
- SC501 Understanding the Old Testament

Either one of the two following papers (20 Credits)

- **RE504** Teaching in a Catholic School (qualified teachers) *capstone paper

One of the following papers can be substituted for TH502 What is Theology?

ENTRY REQUIREMENT This is open to students enrolled in University Colleges of Education (or equivalent) and practising teachers. There is a pre-service component for teacher trainees and an in-service component for qualified teachers.



Other Programmes

Diploma in Christian Studies (Level 6)

Bachelor of Theology

A structured award of 360 credits, (Level 7), three years full-time study. Part-time and distance/online study also available.

Graduate Diploma in Theology

For people who already have a degree level qualification (Level 7- 120 credits) One year full-time study. Part-time and distance/online study also available.

Certificate of Personal Interest (Level 5) *

For people who wish to do one or more papers but do not intend to continue to a higher award.

Safeguarding in the Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand *

For people working in Catholic organisations, as part of increasing awareness and skills to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable adults. Part-time and distance/online study available.
