#### **Message from the Dean**

As New Zealand recently celebrated Mental Health Awareness Week, once again we are offered loads of materials and collaterals surrounding the "mental health crisis". The Church in New Zealand dedicates the 9th of October as Support Life Sunday 2022. It would be timely to reflect on the ministry of Jesus Christ when he spent 3 years of his public life immersed in the daily lives of people



who were desperately searching for meaning in their broken lives. Jesus, the Counsellor continues to be our model in our pastoral care for people's mental well-being.

Most of Jesus' pastoral work took place within personal encounters and in conversations with hurt and troubled individuals. Multitudes of people encountered Jesus personally – Zacchaeus, the woman caught in adultery, the rich young man, Nicodemus, the Samaritan woman in the well, the widow of Nain, and many more - and they all went away with a different perspective on life's challenges. Jesus counselled them so that they were able to accept the thoughts and actions that were becoming burdens in their lives. In the process, they encountered the Kingdom of God. His emphatic words, "my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" should continue to provide peace for many of us who find ourselves trapped in the cares of the modern world. And it all starts with Jesus taking the time to listen to their stories and responding with divine empathy.

# **Enrolment 2023**

Enrolments for Level 7 studies for the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of 2023 is ongoing.

We are pleased to mention that we have designed an enhanced programme of studies leading to the Graduate Diploma in Theology that would be of interest to school teachers and leaders in Catholic schools. Students will now have the option to choose papers from the Bachelor of Divinity or Religious Education course units at NQF level 5 and 6, depending on availability of papers and personal interest.

This Graduate Diploma in Theology programme is a 120 credit, Level 7, NZQA registered qualification. You can study either part-time or full-time. Papers are offered face-to-face at the Auckland campus and also online. The entry requirement is a bachelor's degree in any subject. If you have completed other papers with CTC or another theological provider, you may qualify for recognition of prior learning.
