Reading before the synod, and keeping up as it happens



The Vatican website: <u>https://www.synod.va/en.html</u> provides official documents, background, an app to pray for the synod, and a news feed.

There has been much coverage in the Catholic press, here let's concentrate on less academic sources. Christopher Lamb has covered the process for the Tablet this is an <u>example article</u>. La Civilta Cattolica, a Jesuit publication all in English, has a <u>category for</u> <u>synodality</u> reflections. La Croix, although with its French flavour they are now on summer break, read this <u>reflection</u> from Christine Burke IBVM of the Philippines.

Just using a <u>catalogue search</u> will often uncover more academic papers, sometimes there is a few months embargo on the fulltext. In <u>this article</u>, for instance, Kristin Colberg looks at the relationship between synodality and papal primacy.
