You can study either full-time or part-time. Papers are offered face-to-face at the Auckland campus and online.

Entry Requirement

Applicants must have a University Entrance qualification or seek special admission if 21 years of age or over.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Subject to evaluation, you can apply for credits if you have done previous tertiary studies.
