Looking for NZ Catholic historical sources

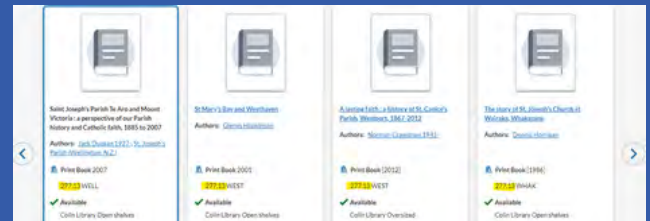
Our classification system makes it easy to browse for these sources:

- 277 New Zealand Church History
- 277.1 Catholic Church: History of NZ Church in general, Events, Ordinations
- 277.11 Catholic Maori Mission
- 277.12 Catholic Dioceses
 - 277.121 History of cathedrals, churches (buildings)
- 277.13 Catholic Parish histories
- 277.14 Catholic School histories
- 277.15 Catholic Religious Order and Congregation histories / lay orders
- 277.16 Catholic Biographies

In practice this can be used with the catalogue eg. if you have found a history of one parish eg.

You see the call number is 277.13 ... At the bottom of the screen you can browse through other titles with the same call number:



As well as browsing another approach is to use the subject headings eg.

Places may also be referred to by different names eg. Kororareka or Russell
