


Academic Writing Seminars

Congratulations to Br Dr Peter Ryan, fsc on his appointment to form part of a "think tank" group that is tasked to generate a stimulus paper to inform and guide a larger scale symposium around the topic of "Charisms and Spiritualities: Prophetic Witnesses to the Voice of the Spirit."This project is initiated by

the La Salle Academy at the Australian Catholic University with the goal of increasing collaboration among those who work in the area of charisms/spiritualities in the Catholic church. Each charism has its distinctiveness, yet all hold so much in common. The La Salle Academy aims to develop and deliver quality teaching and research programs in realising the aspirations of the New Evangelisation.

Inaugural Mass

Bishop John Adams of Palmerston North diocese celebrated the CTC Inaugural Mass which ushered the start of the 2024 academic year.He offered the Mass for the CTC staff "who are in the front line of this worthy mission to disseminate the Roman Catholic intellectual tradition to the students of this college and – I put it to you – further afield."
