#### **CTC Sydney Visit**

Te Kupenga – Catholic Theological College (CTC) offers the Bachelor of Divinity programme as an offshore campus of the Catholic Institute of Sydney (CIS). In 2022, CIS moved its civil accreditation to the University of Notre Dame – Australia (UNDA). This meant that since 2022, CTC has been accredited by UNDA through CIS.

In March 2024, the management of Te Kupenga led by its Chief Executive Robert Blucher, the Director of CTC, Dr John Evangelista and Dean, Fr Merv Duffy sm visited Sydney for a series of meetings with the management of both partner organisations.

It was also the occasion for CTC to be officially represented in the Mass to open the 2024 academic year of the Catholic Institute of Sydney held at St Mary's Cathedral on the 17th of March. Archbishop Anthony Fisher led the celebration together with Bishop Richard Umbers and Bishop Daniel Meagher. He acknowledged the work of the three theological faculties towards the academic formation of both the clergy and the laity.
