We are the successor organisation to Good Shepherd College and The Catholic Institute. The resources and experience of these two institutions are now combined in a single tertiary provider aimed at formation for ministry and leadership.

We were set up by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Conference to develop leaders for the Catholic Community – in schools, parishes, social and pastoral services.

Catholic Theological College is the branch of Te Kupenga that deals with Tertiary Education. We provide courses at levels 5, 6 and 7 on the National Qualifications Framework.

We are a Category 1 NZQA registered Private Training Establishment with a particular focus on providing courses for seminarians and for teachers in Catholic schools, yet open to anyone who wants to study the theological disciplines at a post-secondary level.

CTC is the sole provider of Catholic theological, ministry and religious education qualifications in New Zealand providing leadership formation to Catholics in their ministries.

Scholarships

- 2. Students who are experiencing financial hardships.
- 3. People from Māori and Pasifika groups.



BACHELOR OF DIVINITY

Graduates will have the knowledge and skills that are needed for teaching and maintaining the special character in Catholic integrated schools, for ministry whether by lay people or clergy, and for other chaplaincies and jobs. This programme is offered through the University of Notre Dame Australia.

Level 7
360 credits
3 years full-time or part-time equivalent
On-campus or online study

Programme Structure

Each paper is worth either 15 credits or 7.5 credits.

You can major in either Dogmatic Theology or Sacred Scripture.

Students studying towards this qualification will also do papers in Philosophy, Pastoral Studies and Practice, Moral Theology and Church History.

Entry Requirement

University Entrance or special admission if 21 years or over.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY

Graduates will enhance their professional work and broaden their expertise in preparation for Church leadership roles.

Level 7 120 credits 1 year full-time or part-time equivalent On-campus or online study

Programme Structure

You have the flexibility to choose any combination of eight papers of your interest from the BDiv programme, with two requisites:

- D2000 Fundamental Theology: Faith, Revelation, Theology
- Five 15-credit papers at Stage 3

You can do other papers of your choice from the Bachelor of Divinity or Religious Education programmes.

Bachelor's degree from any field of study

NEW ZEALAND DIPLOMA IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES

Graduates will apply in-depth understanding of theology and biblical foundations in operational or research contexts. They will evaluate, review and respond to the pastoral, specialised and ethical responsibilities for church ministry settings or workplace environments. They will apply management or administrative capability and leadership in a Christian ministry or workplace environment to make strategic decisions.

Level 6 120 credits 1 year full-time or part-time equivalent On-site or online study

Programme Structure

Each paper is worth 15 credits.

There are 3 strands with 8 papers in Theology, Scripture, Pastoral Ministry and Leadership.

- Christian Leadership
- Pastoral Ministry
- Religious Education

Entry Requirement

Level 5 qualification or higher in a related field or Level 5 qualification or higher in a different field, with relevant experience.
